An Ecumenical Offering

God's Work. Our Hands. This theme is an immediate and future need. In various parts of our synod, many continue with the lengthy process of siphoning water from basements, replacing moldy sheetrock, hauling discarded appliances, or sifting remnants for salvageable keepsakes. Suddenly, in the face of crisis, it no longer matters who belongs to which church—it matters that the church is *there*. As in Jesus' story of the Good Samaritan, we find out who our true neighbors are.

There is a deep helplessness in many of us who were less affected by the storms. How can we help? What can we do to convey our compassion and extend our hands to you as our neighbors? Is there an ecumenical response to the needs of our flooded or tornado-stricken neighbors?

Here in Clinton, we experimented with an answer to these questions. In early July, Zion Lutheran Church and First United Methodist Church teamed up and asked other community church bodies to join us in sponsoring a spaghetti supper. Through the local newspaper and church service announcements, the community was invited to eat and also to bid on some silent auction items. Various churches prepared and served the meal or donated items for the auction.

God's abundance was evident in the surprising success!! Tables in the vast fellowship hall had centerpieces which were photos of the flood's devastation. Volunteers flooded the kitchen to spoon up the pasta and splash it with sauce or to divide and serve the donated cakes and bars and pies. An empty flood bucket was marked for donations and generosity was everywhere. Just recently, proceeds from that evening were divided between

First United Methodist and Zion. What a joy it was to send Zion's half, \$4000 (!) to Lutheran Disaster Response.

In 2009, the ELCA's Churchwide Assembly will determine a full communion agreement with the United Methodist Church. Perhaps a humble spaghetti supper in Clinton, Iowa is the foretaste of the oneness to come.

As my twelve years as bishop come to an end and I retire after thirty nine years of pastoral ministry, I know very well that all ministry is interim ministry. There are people who came before me and there will be people who will come after me. That's the way it is in the Church of Jesus Christ. We can be comforted by the work of the Spirit which always raises up new leaders for God's people.

By the grace of God and the work of the Holy Spirit I was brought into the community of faith. It was certainly not my own doing. God worked through people too numerous to name and some whose names I never knew or have forgotten. The church called me to pastoral ministry and the office of bishop. To the extent God's will has been done through my pastoral and Episcopal work, it is by God's grace. Family, congregations, colleagues, friends, and a few enemies have shaped my faith and work. As much as our human nature desires to sing solos, God's work is always done by a mighty chorus, not by an individual. The church of Jesus Christ is a mighty chorus.

While I am retiring from employed pastoral ministry, I am not retiring from being a disciple of Jesus. I am looking forward to finding new ways to serve, probably less institutional, but, I pray, no less faithful. Each new day is a gift. I look forward to time for family, friends, and community. I feel very blessed to have the freedom of retirement. So many people in our world have so few choices and I have so much freedom to choose how to use my time, money, and energy. I am blessed.

I look forward to crossing paths often with those whom I have met in the Southeastern Iowa Synod. I look forward to supporting Bishop Michael Burk in the challenging work to which he has been called. I thank God for the Church and its pastoral ministry in which I have been privileged to serve.

STEWARD-

HOW MUCH DOES GOD WANT ME TO GIVE?

There is no simple answer to this question. It is a matter for Bible study and prayer. The Bible does point us in the direction of an answer by giving us guidelines that may make a good starting point for you on your journey of generosity:

The Tithe. This mandatory 10% offering was an Old Testament benchmark that pointed to God's ownership of all things.

Freewill Offerings. These are voluntary offerings over and above the tithe which are meant to break the power of money in our lives.

Sacrificial Offerings. These are voluntary gifts over and above both the tithe and the freewill offering which flow from our love for God and require that we give up something valuable in order to give.

Radical Generosity. This is giving percentages so large that they do not make sense from a natural point of view, purely out of a desire to invest in God's generosity and to help others.

When soldier and politician Sam Houston (1793-1863) came to faith in Christ, everyone who knew him was surprised. They were even more surprised when, after Houston was baptized, he announced his intent to pay one-half of his minister's salary.

When asked why, he answered by saying,

"My pocketbook was baptized, too".

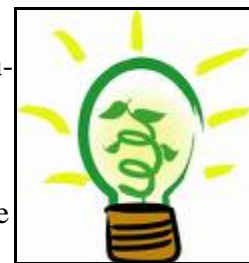

MISSION FOR THE SAKE OF OTHERS

August 2: Nine members of Zion traveled to Cedar Rapids to help in the flood ravaged city. The city looked as though it is well on its way to recovery, though it will take years to get back to normal. As we met at the pre-designated area, we saw Pastor Jen and lots of buckets sitting all by herself. Jerry had dropped her off not long before on his way to Des Moines. We proceeded to the Knights of Columbus and found a group from New Orleans, LA. there to help C.R. refugees, as they know all about flooding and needing help. They had a crew out working on

homes and a crew to fix a creole/cajun meal for the victims of the flood. It still moves my soul to think of THOSE people up here. Zion has sent 2 groups to NOLA this year to help in their recovery and they are sending people up here to help us. UN-BELIEVABLE!

As we left the K.C. and headed to our house, one could see the damage of the water. We turned to go into the neighborhood and you could see the water line on homes and cars. My heart jumped as I thought back to

looking out Miss Cummings' home in NOLA. Cedar Rapids was flooded June 11, so we are now close to two months passed and still no water, no electricity, and outhouses standing on the corners.

We met the owner of the home, Les, a soft spoken man about 50. He is now living with his daughter as he reconditions his home. Ron Huffman said later, "He (Les) had that shocked look on his face", overwhelmed and not

knowing where to start. Pastor Stacy said it best in her sermon 8/2 and 8/3, "overwhelmed and inadequate for the challenge."

Later, after hours of work, Les sat on an old bathtub we had pulled out of the house. Face down and hands on his knees he asked "Why are you here?" Pastor Jen said "We're just here to help." With that he lifted his hands and said, "I don't know what to say. Thank you." As I thought about his question, I thought of the many times in my life when someone has helped me in big and

small ways. I'm simply passing that help on to someone else. That's why I'm here.

Whether his name is Les in C.R. or Miss Cummings in NOLA, or some unknown person in a far off city, people need our help. Our brothers and sisters in Christ need us, our hands, our hearts, our ears, and our prayers. Please be part of our next mission, or the next, or the next...

Pat Cramer for *Three Cups of Tea* telling of Greg Mortenson's building schools in Pakistan.

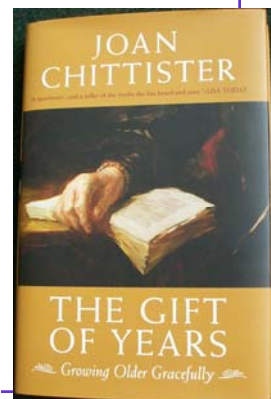
We have been given quite a few new books recently:
